# **Common Strategies for Permanency Action Plans**

#### **Action Plan Strategy**

## Locate and engage family members who are potential permanency resources

### Locate and engage non-family members who are potential permanency resources

- 3) Engage youth in permanency planning
- Engage family members and critical supportive adults in permanency planning
- 5) Advocate for legal actions that will expedite permanency
- Improve child well-being to increase probability of permanency
- 7) Strengthen child's connections to his/her siblings and other family members

#### **Sample Action Steps**

- Talk to parents and other family members, even those in prison, to identify relatives
- Do a thorough and diligent search using all available resources
- Talk to Benjamin regarding people he is currently close to, or has been close to in the past (can use Connectedness Chart or other tools)
- Mine case record
- Work with Stella to complete a Permanency Pact (or ask another adult to do so)
- Ask Marcie's aunt to contact other relatives regarding their ability to provide permanency for her
- Hold a family team meeting focusing on permanency planning for Manuel
- Request change of Temika's legal permanency goal from APPLA to Adoption
- Meet with Gregory's GAL to discuss completion of an adult adoption with Mrs. Adams, his foster mother
- Obtain updated psychological and medical evaluations on Peter to clarify his needs, and underlying conditions, in order to best assist him with controlling his behavior
- Advocate for meeting Janeen's educational needs with the school through an IEP
- Give Elizabeth bus passes so she can visit her siblings every week
- Talk with Tyrell's Uncle James about taking him to baseball games more often
